OUR PROGRAMS

CLLCTIVLY has reached over 180 individuals and organizations through its various initiatives this year.

CLLCTIVLY champions Black-led organizations through a variety of programs aimed at amplifying their visibility and celebrating their work.



28 DAYS OF BLACK FUTURES:

This annual narrative power campaign, taking place during Black History Month, honors, celebrates, and amplifies the stories and impact of Black led organizations serving in Baltimore and beyond.

This year, Von Vargas produced a powerful movement in the Black Futures Cypher, uniting 28 dynamic artists—including Meccamorphosis and CZ Baby—who channeled their artistry into a force for social change.





In celebration of Black Philanthropy Month, CLLCTIVGIVE is Baltimore's only 24-hour crowdfunding campaign uniting residents and donors to support Black-led social change organizations.

The Black Business Quest, part of CLLCTIVGIVE's 24-hour giving campaign, celebrates and supports Black-owned businesses throughout Baltimore while positively impacting the community.

In honor of <u>Black Philanthropy Month</u>, <u>CLLCTIVGIVE</u> is an annual 24-hour crowdfunding campaign supporting Baltimore's Black-led social change organizations.

Our mission is to amplify the voices and visibility of these organizations, enabling them to expand their impact and build stronger community connections. CLLCTIVGIVE provides a unique opportunity for the community to unite and show Greater Baltimore's collective commitment to supporting the critical work of local Black-led changemakers.

The success of CLLCTIVGIVE was driven by the passion and expertise of Baltimore Blackled strategic nonprofit consulting and event management firms, which led this transformative initiative with over 173 participating organizations and businesses.

Their leadership amplified our mission and energized the community's commitment to collective impact, including the day-long Black Business Quest, which featured multiple pop-up events and a visit from Comptroller Brooke Leirman. This innovative approach played a crucial role in engaging participants across Baltimore and showcasing the vitality of Black-owned businesses.

CONNECT


The CONNECT program is a collaborative nine-month initiative led by CLLCTIVLY to enhance organizational resilience and embrace a liberatory approach to serving Baltimore City's youth.

RESIDENCY

Our 2024 residency program features two distinguished leaders: Dr. Yanique Redwood leading multiple initiatives as Scholar-Practitioner, and Sean Yoes as Journalistin-Residence creating compelling documentary series on community impact.

DRS. ELMER + JOANNE MARTIN Social impact fellowship:

Honoring the visionary founders of the National Great Blacks In Wax Museum, this fellowship supports 18 Black social entrepreneurs in Baltimore through a six-month program at the University of Pennsylvania's Center for Social Impact Strategy. The program focuses on leadership development and strategic planning, providing essential training and resources to help leaders increase their community impact and sustain their initiatives.



THE CONNECT PROGRAM INVESTING IN OUR YOUTH

CONNECT is a nine-month cohort focused on deepening relationships and collaboration among nonprofits to improve organizational sustainability, increase fundraising, and move towards a liberatory framework for serving young people in Baltimore City. This year, in partnership with <u>B-CIITY</u> (<u>Baltimore City Intergenerational Initiative for Trauma and Youth)</u> 24 youth-serving organizations participated in the CONNECT Program.

The cohort received a good satisfaction rating from 100% of respondents, with them highlighting the program content, networking, and "safe space" as the most valuable components of their experience.

I feel safe in my body. I know no one will abuse their power. You can't preach to me about liberation but come with microaggressions. Now I can be culturally safe. My spine is elevated and centered. All the leaders are so caring and willing to step back. There's power sharing, which is not typical in a space like that...I feel free. I feel a connection. I love going there, I absolutely do. I don't have to wear a mask. I can just be [me].



The West Baltimore native is expanding his powerful documentary 'DISRUPTION: Baltimore's Highway To Nowhere' while creating four new films celebrating Black Genius in Baltimore through his Black River Film Project.

DRS. ELMER + JOANNE MARTIN SOCIAL IMPACT FELLOWSHIP



CLLCTIVLY launched the award-winning Drs. Elmer and Joanne Martin Social Impact Fellowship, led by Scholar-in-Residence Dr. Yanique Redwood in partnership with University of Pennsylvania's Center for Social Impact Strategy.

Named after the visionary founders of the National Great Blacks In Wax Museum and recognized as Technical.ly's 2024 Program of the Year, this transformative fellowship selected 18 dynamic Baltimore leaders for a fully-funded, six-month intensive program, equipping a new generation of changemakers with resources and networks to drive meaningful social impact in Baltimore.


